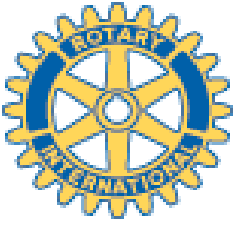

Arini on the Bahá'í Faith. Terrey Hills Rotarian Arini Beaumaris was our guest speaker last meeting. She is a leader and official in the Bahá'í National Assembly of Australia based at the landmark Temple in Ingleside. She told us that the Bahá'í faith is an independent world religion with adherents in virtually every country. The Bahá'í World Centre, the spiritual and administrative heart of the Bahá'í community, is located in the twin cities of Akká and Haifa in northern Israel. Israel is therefore home to three religions.

The Bahá'í temples are set in exquisite gardens.

Bahá'ís enjoy a relatively modern religion with beliefs in the equality of women and men, the recognition and relativity of religious truth i.e. that all of the other religions have valid spiritual values and divine guidance which the Bahá'ís share, universal education, the coming of a unified world government and a universal (auxiliary) language, and that religion is in harmony with scientific knowledge.

New World President

Rotary International President-Elect Banerjee to take over on 1 July 2011



The incoming President RI 2011-12 is **Kalyan Banerjee**. He is a member of the Rotary Club of Vapi, Gujarat, India, which he joined in 1972.

Every year Rotary changes its leadership from the top to bottom, from the World President—Rotary International, to the District Governor to the local Rotary Club. It shows that ideals and goals of an organisation can be passed from one person to another without disruption and the benefits of change often outweigh the experience of incumbency.

The **countries of origin** of the past six RI Presidents is a true indication of Rotary's international coverage:

2006-7 Auckland NZ—William Boyd	2009-10 Grangemouth Scotland—John Kenny
2007-8 Ontario Canada—Wilfrid Wilkinson	2010-11 Kirksville Missouri USA—Ray Klingensmith
2008-9 Seoul Korea—Dong Kurn Lee	2011-12 Vapi, Gujarat, India—Kalyan Banerjee.



Each year the new RI President introduces a new theme and logo for his year of office. This year it is "Reach Within to Embrace Humanity" and the logo is shown at left. Mr Banerjee said he would like to see Rotary "blossom from being the world's most recognized service organization to being the most important NGO [nongovernmental organization] in the world. "Rotary, it is said, has the strength of a government and the tenderness of a parent," he added.

Kalyan Banerjee is a director of United Phosphorus Limited, the largest agrochemical manufacturer in India, and the chair of United Phosphorus (Bangladesh) Limited. He is a member of the Indian Institute of Chemical Engineers and the American Chemical Society, a past president of Vapi Industries Association, and former chair of the Gujarat chapter of the Confederation of Indian Industry. He earned a degree in chemical engineering from the Indian Institute of Technology, Kharagpur, in 1964.

Banerjee has served Rotary as a director, Rotary Foundation trustee, committee and task force chair, International Assembly group discussion leader, president's representative, and district governor.

The chair of the Southeast Asia Regional PolioPlus Committee, Banerjee has served as a member of the International PolioPlus Committee for many years and has attended international meetings with the World Health Organization and UNICEF in that capacity.

Banerjee is a Major Donor, Benefactor, and Bequest Society member, and has been awarded the Foundation's Citation for Meritorious Service and its Distinguished Service Award.

Elevator Speech

You're in an elevator with a colleague who turns to you and asks, "What is Rotary". With less than a minute to answer, what do you say? Try this one from a well known Rotarian -

“Rotary is a volunteer organisation with 1.2 million business and professional leaders from around the world who get together in friendship , provide humanitarian service, and work for peace. They conduct projects to address challenges such as illiteracy, disease, hunger, poverty, lack of clean water, and environmental concerns. One of the cornerstones of Rotary is or firm belief in maintaining high ethical standards in our business, professional, and personal lives.”

Tech Tips.

Adding hyperlinks to words or phrases or pictures in your emails or documents.

With the availability of the Internet most of us read stuff on-line, that is, on our screens, rather than in printed form. We also create emails or letters using a word processor on our computer. By doing so we are reading or creating *electronic* documents. When received, they are usually delivered by email, however it may be that you have received or created a document on a DVD disk.

'Hyperlinks', or just 'links', are imbedded internet (or local addresses to another part of your document) that can take you directly to another location whether it be in the same document or a website across the world. They are easy to set up by you. The easiest way to do this in an email is to copy someone's email address and paste it in your text like this jimb@sgen.com.au. Typically links are converted to blue text and underlined. Usually the system you are using will recognise the '@' sign and link it automatically and open your email program.

However the ones we want to look at here are external links to a website. First you need to get the web address. Just go to the web page you are directing your readers to, **copy** the address showing in the address bar at the top of your browser (highlight it all and press CTRL+C), and return to your document (or email). You can just paste (CTRL+V) it into the text. It should appear blue and underlined. It will work when the reader clicks on it. It may not be pretty because some addresses are very long and and it spoils the look of your writing. Eg

http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=zebbGisX3AE&feature=player_embedded

You can very easily make it look like this “ [Hear Roger Climpson talk about Rotary](#) “, or “What in the World is Rotary? Click [here](#) “. And that link will hide the whole ugly address.

On buttons on the toolbar of your word processor or spreadsheet Link/Unlink making instructions are often shown as two chain segments linked or broken to make or break links.

So here is what to do:

- With the address copied per above (now held on the 'Clipboard' memory) type the phrase or word you want to hyperlink, i.e. to hide the long web address underneath it.
- Highlight the word or phrase. (Hold the mouse button down at the start and move the pointer to where you want the link to end).
- If it's a picture just select the picture, so you see the little handles around the frame—it's now selected.
- You now need to find the 'Hyperlink' or 'link' instruction. It will vary a little depending on the program you are using. (Of course you cannot do it in a PDF document like this one, it needs to be a word processor, spreadsheet, email or similar). Most of the Microsoft documents give a dropdown list containing 'Hyperlink' when you right-click on the highlighted phrase. Others have the chain links button in a toolbar. In Microsoft programs you can also press CTRL+K. By right-click>Hyperlink or CTRL+K you will open a dialog box.
- You will see some instructions like: “Link to” - select “Existing Folder or Web Page” button.
- Click in the area where you are to put the Address. Paste it from clipboard into the area (CTRL+V). You will see the address that you copied. OK. You are done and the phrase should be underlined blue and pics should be a live link.

Depending on the application that you are using the link might require you to hold CTRL while you click. Finally If you are having real problems creating a link in the application that you are creating your document in, try this—open a Word document, type the word or phrase, hyperlink it as above. Now highlight it and copy it and go to your application and paste it into it.
